- 1 one-year hard-copy Post history for showcase (these entries will be showcased at National Convention)
- 1 one-year digital Post history for showcase (these entries will be showcased on the online exhibit)

Those of us who were at the 2024 History Book judging and NADHAL Meeting on October 7 and 8 this year became aware of changes to the way we will be judging history books in the future.

As an organization we have been meeting at the national convention after the National Historian luncheon. This was always a brief meeting to update everyone on what was going on and coming in the future. Then we would meet in October during the Fall NEC Meeting to judge history books, and the winners were announced by the National Historian to the NEC. We held our annual meeting and voted on new officers for NADHAL. This was the time we made changes to our organization (C&B. resolutions, etc.). And this was the time we gathered and caught up on each other's lives.

With the changes coming in 2025, the National Historian luncheon will not be happening. So, there will not be a short NADHAL meeting. And since all judging will be done digitally, there will not be an inperson NADHAL meeting during the National NEC Fall meetings.

I have requested a time and place for a meeting during the 2025 National Convention. I have been offered a time of 4:00 pm after the History Book Showcase. This has not been confirmed so don't put it on your calendar yet.

I'm asking for a 3-hour time block in order to conduct our usual business of elections and officer reports. Also, during this time, I believe we need to look at our Constitution and Bylaws to bring them in line with the changes for 2025. During this time, we can have meaningful discussions on the changes coming and decide our future. I'll be asking the C&B team (James Fratolillo, Steve DeFoe, Tom Wiley and Charemon Dunham) and the Judge Advocate to review the current C&B and be prepared to present changes in August 2025.




