The Third District Spring Conference was held at Post 84 in Monroe on April 19, 1997.

Cmdr Ken "Skip" Gust called the conference to order at 9 AM.

Colors were presented.

Opening prayer by Chaplain Bud Mautz.

Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Roll call of Officers by Adj Dennis Baures and a copy is attached.

Guest attending were Past Nat. Cmdr Keith Krueger and Past Dist Cmdr Louie Arndt among the regular higher office holders which are members of the 3rd District.

Candidates running for office were Dave Wegener, 2nd and Earl Rigg, 4th District commanders for Dept Vice Cmdr.

Minutes from the Fall Conference held at Richland Center on Oct 6th 1996 were read and approved as read.

Welcome remarks by Green County Sheriff, Mayor Bill Gough, Police Chief Fred Kelley Post Cmdr John Dahlan and Green County Cmdr Harold Loomis.

Americanism report by Dave Gough is attached covering Apathy, the problem with membership.

Camp American Legion by Camp Board Director Ralph Schulenberg. He has brochures and new applications for attending Camp. The 40 et 8 shed fell in because of snow load. Dane County cabin leaks. The first weekend in May will be clean up time. Much damage was caused in Camp during the heavy snows of winter.

Finance Officer Hans Streich reports total monies on hand on Apr 19 at \$2346.38 and a copy is attached.

The proposed budget is also attached. Four posts have not yet paid per capita dues.

Children and Youth by Dick Linder, He read a list of pamphlets which are available from either the Dept or National Headquarters. The Annual reports are due on or before June 1st. Last year only 46% reported.

Consolidates reports are due the same time. Both are Mandatory. Next year will be better.

At this time Cmdr Skip escorted Dist Pres Rosie Wegner into the room. Pres Rosie lost the membership bet, so Cmdr Skip received a TOP GUN Hat. She also presented the District with a check for \$250 for the INFORMER and directories. Green County Pres Bonnie Zurfluh welcomed everyone to the Conference.

Back to reports.

Legislative Chris Zales reports two pieces of legislation are the GI Bill of Health and the Flag Amendment are coming to the floor again.

Resolution committee are Ralph Schulenberg, Gary Petersen, Kieth Lovell, Chris Zales Bud Mautz and Jerry Williams. Guest Roger Mathison is running for Dept Cmdr.

Back to reports. Membership Pat Young as of Apr 19 the district has Crawford and LaFayette county at 100%. Iowa needs 3 to make 100%. The District is 99.55%. He suggest we find a new approach to recruit new members.

At this time Cmdr Skip went to meet with Aux and V Cmdr Pat chair the conference. Every post should have a DARE program for the youth. He thanked Bud Mautz for signing him up as a Legion member. Chris Zales asked for another member to judge winner of Leg of the Year and Police officer of the Year.

Resolutions commêttee reported by Gary Petersen. Res #1 are thank you resolution for the Post 84 and Unit 84 and the City for the comference.

#2 is the resolution to relocate the Dept Headquarters. The resolution was approved by voice vote and forwarded to the State Convention in July at Green Bay.

After lunch State Cmdr Dale Peterson spoke about membership and we exceeded the Nation Goal. Wis has 96.63% on this day. Camp American Legion is running ads on Radio and Television about the camp and how to get there.

VA & R Jim Bobarts reports VISN in 22 divisions. VERA is divsion 12 received 8 million dollars less than last year.

Catagory C no longer get care at the VA. Those receiving care can still go. This means less care for fewer veterans. Veterans with cold weather injuries like forstbite or frozen will have long terms effects.

Good for the American Legion:


Change the By-Laws about selecting the site for Spring
